COVID 19 Measures

- We continue to have measures in place to ensure your children and the staff are safe here at Lowbrook.

- There will also be spellings to learn every week and also termly Spelling Star.

Homework

- All children should read at home every night and should complete their reading records daily. These will be checked every day by myself or Mrs Redjeb.
- Please ensure your child is reading a variety of different texts and genres.
- It is expected that homework is always completed and handed in on time (except in special circumstances).
- If homework is not completed by the due date, children may be asked to stay in for part of their lunch break and complete some or all of it with me.
- If children are having some difficulties with homework, we will be more than happy to go over it again with them.

Google Classroom

• We will continue to use Google Classroom as a way of setting the homework for the children. Please ask your children to check their Google Classroom.

SATS

- SATs will take place week commercing 9th May 2022.
- Throughout Year 6 and leading up to the SATs the children will be fully prepared through class lessons and through past paper practice.
- There will be no surprises! The children will be taught everything in class that could come up in the tests.
- English Grammar and Punctuation Paper I and Spelling Paper 2
- English Reading
- Mathematics Paper 1: Arithmetic
- Mathematics Paper 2: Reasoning
- Mathematics Paper 3: Reasoning

PE

The class will have two PE lessons per week.

This term, P.E. will take place on Wednesday and Friday.

Children should come into school in their kit.

 Wednesday is either the new kit or a white t-shirt and black shorts.

Friday is black shorts and black t-shirt.

Communication
