

PE

Homework

Homework

- All children should read at home every night and should complete their reading records <u>daily</u>. These will be checked every day by myself or Mrs Redjeb.
- Please ensure your child is reading a variety of different texts and genres.
- It is expected that homework is always completed and handed in on time (except in special circumstances).
- If homework is not completed by the due date, children may be asked to stay in for part of their lunch break and complete some or all of it with me.
- If children are having some difficulties with homework, we will be more than happy to go over it again with them.

Google Classroom

 We will continue to use Google Classroom as a way of setting the homework for the children. Please ask your children to check their Google Classroom.

 Contact between school and home should be written or emailed separately.

Term time absences

 All term time absence requests must go through the office and are reviewed on a case by case basis.

These will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

Holidays during term time will not be authorised.

SATs

- SATs will take place week commencing 8th May 2023.
- Throughout Year 6 and leading up to the SATs the children will be fully prepared through class lessons and through past paper practice.
- There will be no surprises! The children will be taught everything in class that could come up in the tests.

- English Reading
- Mathematics Paper 1: Arithmetic
- Mathematics Paper 2: Reasoning
- Mathematics Paper 3: Reasoning
