- Continuous provision focuses on the children learning through play and exploration.
- Supports the children's developmental needs. Eg, communication and language.
- They are in charge of their learning.
- Gives them time to consolidate their learning.
- Recorded through images and observations.

Reading

- An emphasis on mastery and fluency within reading and comprehension as per the National Curriculum.
- Exposure to a range of book genres.
- Please ask your child a range of questions before (from the cover), during and after reading. Using who, what, why, where, when, how.
- Children will be assessed every other term to determine their development in both fluency of reading and comprehension.
- Re-reading books is a necessary task, which we encourage.



 It would be greatly appreciated if you could support this at home by encouraging the correct pen grip and highlighting the importance of presentation for homework etc.

Phonics




- Each morning, pupils receive a monster phonics lesson which will continue to teach the children new sounds while recapping what they have already learnt in Early Years.
- Pupils will continue to work with the monsters that each correspond to a colour which matches a sound.
- Pupils have been assessed and grouped accordingly to reflect their phonic knowledge for guided reading which happens 3 times a week. At the end of the week, pupils will take home the book they have been reading in school to independently read with you for the week. This develops reading their fluency.



Phonics Screening

- Carried out in June
- One-to-one setting
- Comprised of 20 real words and 20 'alien' (pseudo) words
- Tests the children's ability to decode words



Homework

Reading books will be changed on a Monday (sharing books),
 Wednesday (library books) and Friday (Monster Phonics books).

It is expected that each child undertakes daily reading, and this is recorded in the reading record.

Schedule

Monday-Thursday:

Your children will take home a monster phonics sheet. This sheet includes the sound that we learnt that day and handwriting practice for that sound.

Friday:

Spellings (for following week spelling test). A maths sheet will also go home for the weekend.
