

Our Early Years Philosophy

Our philosophy is based on the belief that all children will be good readers, writers, mathematicians and spellers as they progress through the school but furthermore that all children should be given a personalised education that ensures they all enter the primary phase as well-rounded children who have achieved their EYFS objectives.

They must be inquisitive about the world around them and have good and developing oracy skills.



Our Early Years Philosophy

Through play, our children explore and develop learning experiences, which help them make sense of the world.

At Lowbrook, the children receive a balance of child-initiated and adult led learning judged appropriate to each child.

Assessments are based on daily observations of children learning in a range of contexts. Some observation will be planned and other spontaneous. We place a strong emphasis on communication and language development. This follows the new Statutory Framework for EYFS 2021.





The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Profile

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the framework for the provision of learning, development and care for children between birth and the academic year in which they turn five (0-5).

The revised EYFS profile requires practitioners to assess children against a set of 17 early learning goals (ELGs) by the end of the reception year. It is based on ongoing observation and assessment in the three prime and four specific areas of learning, and the three characteristics of effective learning as follows.





The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Profile

Prime

- Personal, social & emotional development
- Communication and language
- Physical development

Characteristics of Effective Learning

- Playing and exploring
- Active learning
- Creating and thinking critically.

Specific

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts & Design

To achieve a "good level of development" children must achieve at least the "expected level" within the three prime areas of learning: communication and language; physical development; and personal, social and emotional development, as well as the early learning goals within the literacy and mathematics areas of learning.

The First Term

- We will be focusing on Phase 1
 phonics, which includes nursery
 rhymes before commencing Phase 2.
- Your child will be given a reading scheme book which will be changed on a Monday and Thursday every week.
- On a Thursday, they will also take home a library book to be returned the following Thursday.
- Maths will focus on counting; numbers up to 10 and numerical patterns
- Our topics: All About Me & Under The Sea





Homework

- Reading daily.
- A daily phonics task will be set in the homework book. These will all be sent home on a Monday to be completed through the week and returned on Friday.
- High frequency or red words to learn to read and extension could also learn to spell. These will be set on Google Classroom on a Friday.
- A maths challenge will be set via Google Classroom on a Friday.





Phonics

- Phonics is the link between the written from of letters and the sound they make.
- Using a highly structured programme working through 6 progressive phases, children are taught:
- The full range of common letter / sound correspondences
- To hear separate sounds within words.
- To blend sounds together.






Phonics

Phase 1

- Showing awareness of rhyme and alliteration.
- Distinguishing between sounds they hear.
- Exploring and experimenting with words and sounds.
- Orally blend and segment.

Phase 2

- Using common consonants and vowels.
- Blending for reading and segmenting for spelling.
- Understanding that words are made from sounds and that sounds are represented by letters.






Phonics

Phase 3

- Reading and spelling a range of CVC words.
- Using all the letters and consonant digraphs (ch, sh, ng, th).
- Using long and short vowel phonemes.

Red words

- Each week, the children learn tricky words.
- These are key sight words.
- They are not always spelt phonetically.









Daily Routines

- All class teachers are on the playground from 8:45am when the gate is unlocked.
- KS1 and KS2 line up in their classes on the playground. KS1 children are taken by their teacher to wash their hands. KS2 then wash their hands before going to their classrooms.
- Early Years children are walked by ONE parent or carer to the EYFS
 playground from 8:45am, where they will be met by a member of staff at
 the gate. From there, they will go straight into their classrooms. Masks are
 compulsory for parents on the school site.
- At the end of the day, the gates open at 3.15pm. KS1 and KS2 children will be collected from their classrooms at 3.15pm.
- Parents and carers of EYFS collect their child from the Early Years gate.
 Masks are compulsory for parents on the school site. Please follow the one way system to exit the school site.



Healthy Tuck Shop

- Available every day during morning break time.
- Non-profit making.
- 20p for a piece of fruit/veg.
- Please put money in a named purse.
- For afternoon snack, children are provided with an additional piece of fruit free of charge.



Lunchtimes

- We are currently staggering lunch times across the school to maintain social distancing.
- Caterlink is our lunchtime catering provider.
- Menus are changed on a three-week rotation.
- **ALL** hot lunches must be ordered for via Scopay in advance.
- Universal free school meals apply until KS2.

Please bring a packed lunch for your induction day.



Breakfast Club

- The school hosts a Breakfast Club which starts at 8.00am.
- Currently it costs £4.00 per session. This must be booked and paid for in advance by mid-day the day before the session is required via Scopay.
- These costs may increase in the future.

- Paid and pre-booked in advance by mid-day the day before the session is required via Scopay
- 3.15pm until 6.15pm
- £10.00 per child.
